Reporting to Parents

Teaching staff are currently busy preparing their students' half yearly reports. The reports provide explicit information on the educational progress that each student has achieved this semester. They convey very important information in terms of student performance in all Key Learning Areas, together with an indication of the level of effort and application that each child has been demonstrating in the first two terms of this year. The format of the reports is in line with state reporting requirements to ensure consistency in the way student performance is reported to parents across the state. The five point grading system used indicates the assessment levels of achievement for each student and is explained on the front page of each report. The assessment levels are here for your prior information:

Outstanding Achievement:

The student has extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge.

High Achievement:

The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills.

Sound Achievement:

The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

Basic Achievement:

The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.

Limited Achievement:

The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in a few areas of content and has achieved very limited competence in the processes and skills.

Student half yearly reports will be forwarded home in the week commencing 21 June. Teachers will be informing parents and caregivers of the dates of their parent/teacher report meetings this week.

Meetings are to be held in Weeks 10 and 11 of this term, and for some classes, in Weeks 1 and 2, Term 3. All parents and caregivers are encouraged to take up the invitation to attend these meetings to have the report explained and to discuss their child's progress and achievements. It is also an ideal opportunity to raise any issues that parents may have regarding their child's education.

Weekly Happenings

This week sees many extra curricular activities taking place that aim to enrich the students' school lives and promote the

talents and the programs of the school. This afternoon, Mrs Gulliford, took a group of senior students to the Home of Compassion to perform a dance and a musical item for the residents. Tomorrow, the Year 6 students are participating in a 'Taster Day' at Mount Austin High School where they will engage in Science, Visual Arts and French activities. Also tomorrow, the girls softball team will be competing in a softball gala day at French Fields. On Thursday the girls league tag team will be competing in the finals of the Mortimer Shield at Parramore Park. Thank you to the teachers for their organisation, coaching, supervision, etc, to enable these activities to occur.

Video Conference with Author

Last Friday, about forty K – Year 2 students had the privilege of being involved in a video conference with author, Andrew Daddo. In the half hour link-up, Andrew Daddo spoke of his life, the children's books that he had written and answered questions from children involved in the video conference from around NSW. Alyssa Charlton from 2D asked an excellent question on how he chooses his illustrators. Andrew Daddo was very impressed with this question.

It is critical that parents and caregivers provide the school office with up-to-date contact details. 


Child Protection




