These meetings provide the opportunity for parents to speak to their child's teacher regarding academic progress and social adjustment. Student Personalised Learning Plans will also be discussed at this time. It is important for your child to understand that you value their education and that you are

These meetings also provide the opportunity for the parent/caregiver and the teacher to establish and build a positive rapport, which will greatly enhance the communication between the school and the home. I strongly encourage all parents and caregivers to take this opportunity to organise a meeting with their child's teacher.

Values Day Excursions

On Thursday 24 June and Friday 25 June, many of the students will be participating in an excursion to recognise their exemplary behaviour at school. In order to participate in these excursions, students must not have had a Green Slip issued to them from 10 May until the date of the excursion. Students who qualify will be given an invitation to participate as a reward for consistently upholding the school values of **respect, self discipline, tolerance and honesty**. Year 3 to 6 students will be going to the Oasis Aquatic Centre as their reward and K – 2 students to Noah's Ark. All students have been constantly informed and reminded from the beginning of the term of the conditions for their participation, so they will be well aware of their involvement in the excursions or not.

Anti-Bullying Policy

It is a mandatory requirement that every government school has a policy and procedures on the recognition of bullying behaviour and the management of them. As such, this school's policy is an integral part of the school's discipline and student welfare practices. A section of the policy deals specifically with the expectations of students, staff and parents and caregivers in regards to bullying. The key policy points that relate to parental expectations are to:

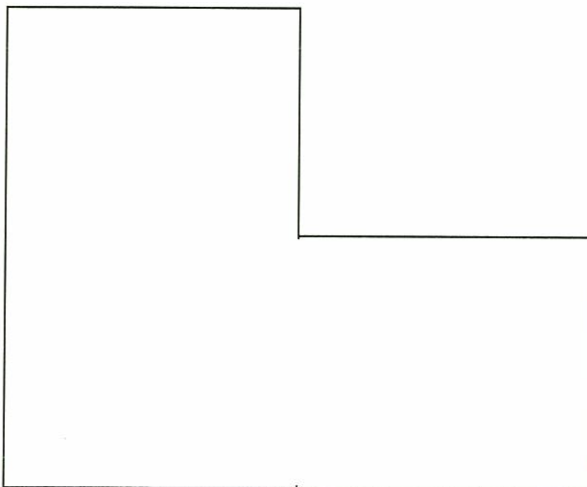

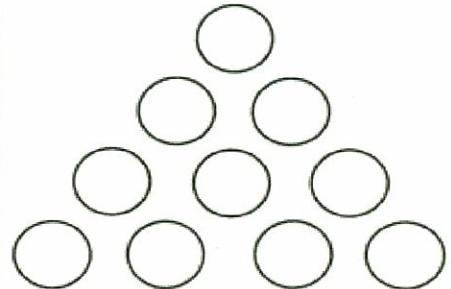
Infants Maths Puzzle of the Week

Geometry Mind Twister 2

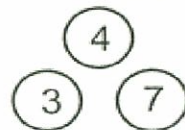
Divide this shape into four identical parts

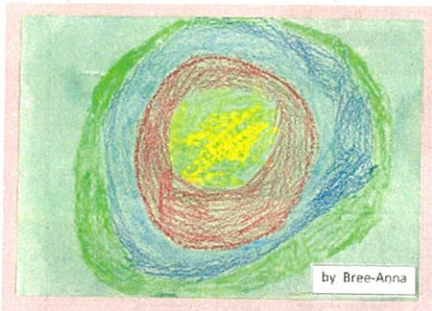
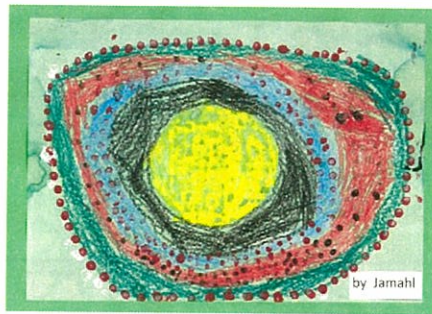
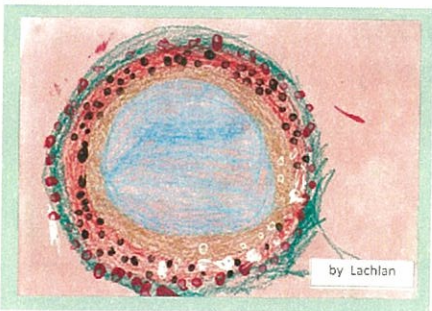
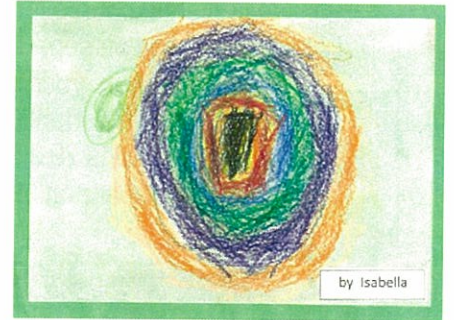
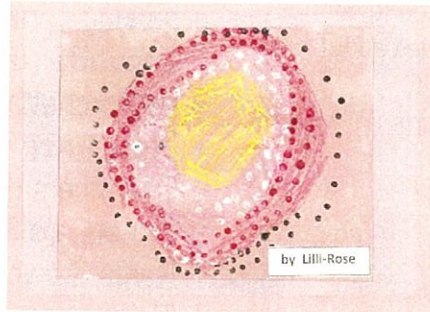
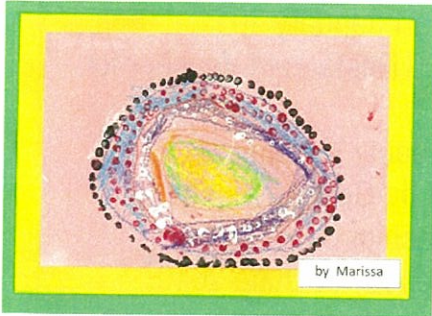


For example, the difference between 3 and 7 is 4, so put a 4 above the 3 and 7.

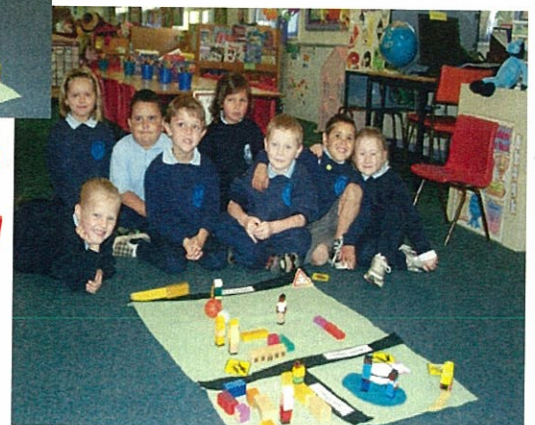
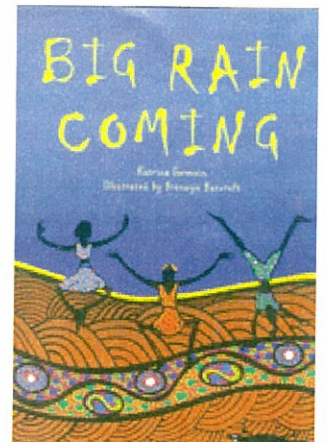
KB artwork
