NAIDOC Celebrations

To mark this important time in the year, the school will be conducting its National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Day of Celebration (NAIDOC) Day on Wednesday 30 June. Preparations for this day have already begun with a variety of activities planned. The day will commence with a combined NAIDOC and special student welfare assembly in the school hall. It is at this time that students, who have achieved level rises in our school's student welfare system, will be recognised and congratulated. During the second learning session of the day, students will be involved in an Aboriginal art activity in their classrooms. Students will also participate in an Indigenous games tabloid in their respective peer support groups in the afternoon. Leading up to NAIDOC Week, students have been decorating boomerangs with wood burnings. A more detailed notice of NAIDOC Day activities will be provided in next week's bulletin.




